

PROPOSED INDICATORS FOR PRIMARY HEALTH ORGANISATIONS REPORT TO LOCAL DIABETES TEAMS

Primary Health Organisations (PHOs) or Independent Practitioners Associations (IPAs) report data collected at the time of a free annual check. Collated data are reported to Local Diabetes Teams (LDTs) and can be used to provide feedback at the health care practitioner, PHO or DHB level. These reports are powerful agents for changing health care practitioner behaviour and can be used in quality improvement initiatives.

THE DRAFT REVISED DATASET INCLUDES

The Number of People with:

- Type 1 diabetes
- Type 2 diabetes
- Other types of diabetes
- Completed eye screening
- HbA1c >7% and ≤8%
- HbA1c >8%

For People with Type 2 Diabetes Only, the Number with:

- Diet only treatment
- HbA1c >8% on diet only treatment
- Oral treatment
- HbA1c >8% on oral treatment

Overall, the Number of People with:

- ACE-Inhibitor or A2 receptor-blocker therapy
- Microalbuminuria or nephropathy
- Microalbuminuria or nephropathy and taking ACE-Inhibitor or A2 receptor-blocker therapy
